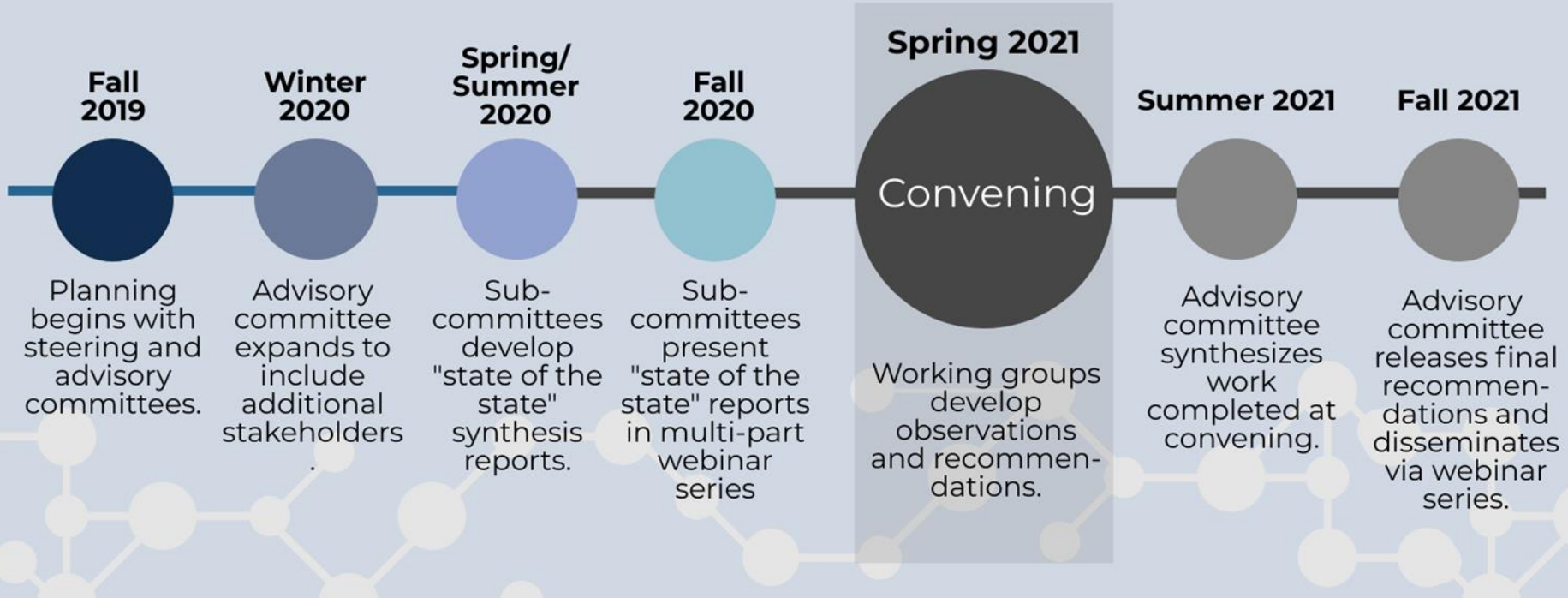

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Why is it important to support women veterans' entry into STEM careers?
